
Please ensure that your child attends in full school uniform.






Many of the children past and present have spent a lot of time with Mrs Garrett.

At Pinehurst Primary, we are passionate about getting the best outcomes for our children so that they can be as successful as possible, in later life.

Research has proven that children who attend school regularly do better both academically and socially.

The minimum attendance that we expect at school is 97% and we want to work with our children and families to achieve this.

The chart below shows how important good attendance is to your child's progress.

100% Very best chance of success	99 - 97% Off to a flying start	96 - 93% Less chance of success	92 - 90% At risk of becoming a Persistent Absentee (Harder to make progress)	Less than 90% Persistent Absentee (Large amounts of learning and social opportunities missed)
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We appreciate that children become unwell and may need time off from school but we are aware that too many days are missed, when children are actually well enough to attend.

If children **miss 10 unauthorised sessions** of school, parents may receive a **Notice to Improve**, which could result in a Penalty Notice, should attendance continue to be a concern.

BIG NEWS... Help us raise money for our school with ASDA

Attention ALL Parents and Carers

You can apply for Free School Meals if you receive any of the following benefits:

Income based Jobseeker's Allowance. Income related Employment Support Allowance. Income Support.

Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.

The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit.

Child Tax Credit - as long as you have a yearly household income of less than £16,190 (as assessed by HM

Revenue and Customs) and do not get Working Tax Credit.

Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit). Universal Credit - provided you have an annual net earned income not exceeding £7,400 (£616.67 per month).

This applies to ALL year groups and can impact on you being eligible for any FSM initiatives including food vouchers made available around holiday periods.
