



Pinehurst Primary School Twitter Policy

'Experience, Excel and Enjoy'

Rationale

The rationale of this policy is to explain acceptable use of Twitter relating to the Pinehurst Primary School Twitter feed @PinehurstP for staff, children, parents and governors.

The policy will therefore aim to explain the purpose of Twitter in Pinehurst Primary School and the benefits that will arise from its proper use, and also avoid any potential pitfalls using this technology.

What is Twitter?

Twitter is used primarily as a method of communication made up of 140 characters called a 'Tweet'. Tweets tend to reference people, places, and/or activities to which the said referee can respond. Tweets either directly reference another person or broadcast information to which others can reply and respond. Twitter users are able to follow or be followed. To follow somebody/thing ensures that all of their activity and comments appear in the followers news feed. The obvious benefit of having followers is that the information you broadcast is instantly distributed into their news feed. Users can also private message each other when they don't want conversations to appear. @PinehurstP will not enter into private discussions with others.

What is the primary purpose of @PinehurstP?

- @PinehurstP will be used principally to be followed by staff, parents and other professionals in order to promote the excellent work by staff, children, parents and governors.
- Similarly, it will also contain information detailing special events in school. The aim of this is to run alongside more traditional methods like sending home letters, and not to replace it.

Who controls content for @PinehurstP?

The uploading of content for @PinehurstP will be controlled by the whole staff.

Who can follow @PinehurstP?

- @PinehurstP is a public account
- The school retains the right to block any followers who post content that is deemed to be inappropriate (see below).

Who will @PinehurstP follow?

- In order to protect itself from inappropriate content being distributed into its news feed, @PinehurstP will not actively seek to follow other users. However, exceptions may be made where following an @ handle has obvious benefits to the school.
- @PinehurstP sees itself more as a distributor of information to those who follow it and not as a receiver of information.

What information will be shared @PinehurstP?

- @PinehurstP is solely sharing information and events involving Pinehurst Primary School.
- The @PinehurstP Twitter account will retain a professional boundary at all times, no personal information will be tweeted.
- Tweets that promote our school in a positive light will may be retweeted.

When is it acceptable to respond to tweets?

- @PinehurstP account will not reply to all 'replies' on Twitter.
- @PinehurstP is solely for information and will not discuss any school matters.

How to protect @PinehurstP

- @PinehurstP username and password are only known by the staff.

When will @PinehurstP be active?

- @PinehurstP will be active between the hours of 8am-6pm Monday to Friday.
- Tweets will only be made outside of this time for school events (e.g. sports, residential trips, performances) or to share urgent school news (e.g. closures due to adverse weather).

What information will be shared relating to individual pupils at the school?

- Photographs
- Work produced by pupils (not identified by name)
- @PinehurstP will only post an individual child's initials
- Individual achievements of pupils, both in and out of school (with consent from parent/carer)

Do parents/carers have to provide consent for information relating to their child to be published by @PinehurstP?

- The school will use consent provided under the Liverpool City Council's Acceptable Use Policy which parents complete when enrolling their child at the school.
- Parents/carers who have specific concerns about information relating to their child being posted on @PinehurstP should address these to the Headteacher.

What is inappropriate content and referencing and how will it be dealt with?

@PinehurstP welcomes any referencing, mentions, or interactions that position the school in a positive light only. Therefore, Pinehurst Primary School deems any of the following as inappropriate:

- Comments that aim to undermine the school, its staff, pupils, parents, governors or others affiliated with the school.
- Offensive language or remarks aimed at the school, its staff, pupils, parents, governors or others affiliated with the school.
- Unsuitable images or content posted into its feed.
- Unsuitable images or content finding its way from another's account into the @PinehurstP feed.
- Images or text that infringe upon copyright.

Any inappropriate content will be deleted and its users will be removed, blocked, and, depending on the nature of the content, reported to Twitter. Furthermore, incidents of a more serious nature may be reported to the appropriate authority.

How will safer internet be promoted alongside Twitter?

@PinehurstP is primarily for parents and guardians. However, the school's use of Twitter promotes the use of social media to the children. In addition to Internet Safety week, e-safety will be reinforced through any use of computing in other subject areas.

If a child requests to follow @PinehurstP, the E-Safety officer (Computing Lead) will be notified.
